Don't ever underestimate the Barbie's and Ken's in your class, because they are quite smart and hard working. It is quite common to spot them reading in the library and that's because each course demands on average 100-150 pages worth of reading per week. So plan your courses carefully if you want to also attend social activities and travel.

Concerning the places to see and things to do, Denmark is quite famous for its colorful houses at NyHavn (New Port), Lego Land, and of course, the lille havfrue (little mermaid). During free time, be sure to grab a hot coco and cake from *La Glace*, a famous cake shop which has been around for over 100 years. Regarding groceries shopping, there are 3 types of groceries stores: expensive (Aldi, Fakta, Netto- less selection), very expensive (Føtex, Super Brugsen- wider selection), and unbelievably expensive (Irma-organic produce). Our advice is to read the weekly catalogue and plan your purchase if you want to control your budget. On average, a loaf of bread is around 100-120 baht and half-kilo chicken is around 200 baht. Of course, if you cannot cook, you can always eat at CBS canteen, which provides a variety of food selection. But be prepared to pay 200 baht+ for a meal without a drink!





Traveling around Copenhagen is quite easy and convenient. The main options are S-tog, metro, bus, bicycle, walk, and (rich) friend's car. Useful websites for route planning are krak.dk and rejseplanen.dk, which tells you the length of journey, schedule for bus/metro, and map. Most people can speak fluent English so if you ever get lost, just ask. Danes are very helpful.

Traveling outside of Copenhagen is also easy and can be made cheap. Exercise your Facebook network and free get accommodation from friends studying in Europe. If you're lucky, board will be included. Also, make sure to book your tickets well in advance to get the lowest rate. Lonely Planet, European on a Shoestring will become your bible so don't ever forget to bring it.
